

## **Ulcerative Colitis**

Ulcerative colitis is a recurrent inflammation of the colorectum. It is characterized by bloody diarrhea, abdominal pain, fever, anemia and weakness. It usually develops between the ages of 25 - 45 and 10 - 15% of cases have a family history of this disease. Inflammation limited to the rectum (ulcerative proctitis) is a more mild form of the disease when compared to inflammation of the entire colon. Those with ulcerative colitis have a higher incidence of colon cancer, especially if the disease has been present for more than 10 years. Regular checkups with colonoscopy are important. Treatment may include anti-diarrheal agents, 5-ASA compunds such as sulfasalazine, corticosteroids, immunosuppressive agents, or surgery. A total colectomy (removal of entire colon with or without colostomy) is curative.
